

It's incredible how, when we don't pay attention to what we're imbibing day after day, it catches up with us. 




# *Premiere Aquascapes*

# "THE UNKNOWN RESTAURANT CRITIC"

Elkhart County is blessed with many fine restaurants, so my wife and I have taken it upon ourselves to visit as many as possible and report our findings to you. It's a rough job but someone has to do it. The restaurants do not know who we are and are not notified prior to a visit so that we can get an authentic experience of their hospitality, food and surroundings.

The first restaurant we visited was Lucchese's, located at 655 County Road 17, in Elkhart. It is in a shopping center and has plenty of parking conveniently located in front of the establishment. When coming from the south it is difficult getting into the parking lot because of the restricted entrance directly out front. We recommend turning west at the stop light on the south end of the shopping center to get easier access and avoid the goofy front entrance.

The décor of the restaurant is pleasant and not overdone. It is clean and well organized. Tables and booths are both available depending on your mood. Linen napkins add a touch of class that is appreciated and there is a fine list of wines for those who are connoisseurs. The waiters and waitresses were very attentive and made us feel welcome. This is a restaurant that lets its food do its talking.

I ordered the Chicken Marsala and my wife ordered the Spinach and Mushroom Lasagna. The chicken was so tender that a fork could cut it and it was served on a bed of pasta along with mushrooms and in a sauce that was exceptional. The Lasagna was worth writing home about, with a homemade flavor that made you want more. All this was served with complimentary Italian bread that we could dip in Olive oil and spices.

After dinner we had coffee and were presented with a

choice of desserts. We shared a piece of Turtle Cheese cake that was drizzled with chocolate and whip cream on the side. We are looking forward to having another piece some day.

The only disappointment was the Italian dressing on a tossed salad. It was bland and had little taste which is surprising in a restaurant specializing in Italian food.

There is one other problem with this kind of food. When eating it you must first determine if you are a slob. The delicious sauces managed to splatter all over the front of my nice new shirt. That shirt will always be a favorite from now on. Each spot will remind us of that wonderful dinner.

Prices were in the mid-range and our two dinners cost around fifty dollars. The best compliment I can give is that I intend to go back for more. We highly recommend Lucchese's to you for a fine experience.







unately, every tricycle that they had tried up to this point was just a little too big for them and they couldn't quite reach the pedals. any more, I'd hear Grady say "Again, please, Mommy." And you can imagine, the cycle continued. Minute after minute. Day after day. Week after week.

By the middle of March, when the weather started getting nicer and we were spending more time outside, I was starting to think that maybe I'd made the wrong decision. Maybe the kids just didn't have the motor skills at 2 1/2 years old to pedal those bikes. Or maybe they would have been able to reach the tricycle pedals by now. Maybe they're just not going to grow quite tall enough to reach the pedals to ride the bikes this spring and summer. They just weren't quite able to get it and my back was feeling it.

About that time, my husband and I went to an event with his family in Texas and left the kids with my parents for about 5 days. When we returned home with them, the first thing I noticed was that my children looked taller than when I'd last seen them. I really think they'd had a growth spurt while I was away. The first thing they noticed was their

bikes. They wanted to ride (be pushed around on) their beloved bikes that they'd missed for 5 whole days. Though we'd done it a hundred times, I didn't mind a bit. I'd missed the kids and was excited to play with them again.

To my surprise, Grady jumped on his bike and within minutes, he was pushing those pedals around like he'd been doing this for months. All by himself. I was thrilled. The next day, Karli was riding all by HERself. They had grown and I knew that was a large part of their success...just being a smidge taller made a big difference. But I also think that they just got the hang of it. Whatever it was, something clicked for both of them and I was a happy mom. I was getting to enjoy a few minutes of relax time every day while they happily practiced riding their bikes around and around, all by themselves.
