"Spiritual Fitness"

With the weather improving, many of us are anticipating getting outdoors and being a little more active. We are thinking about where we will go for Spring Break or summer vacation and making plans accordingly. And after being cooped up all winter, we may even be thinking about getting some long-overdue exercise and shaping up for those occasions on which extra pounds will be all to obvious without these bulky sweaters on.

But aside from slimming down a bit, there are other benefits to getting more exercise. It is one of the ironies of human life that some of the work we do and the effort we put forth actually results in us being uplifted and energized to do even more. Doctors and fitness gurus tell us that getting physical exercise makes us feel more energetic than if we sit around all day watching game shows and soap operas, or playing video games. The same is true of our spiritual lives as well. Some of what we do makes us truly weary. Listening to the news or getting a phone call with bad news can take the sap right out of us spiritually. Roasted Chicken Salad



1 (2 to 3 pound) whole chicken

4 tablespoons olive oil

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

3/4 cup mayonnaise

2 tablespoons chopped fresh dill

1 cup seedless red grapes, sliced

1 (11 ounce) can mandarin oranges, drained

1/2 cup sunflower seeds 24 miniature croissants

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Brush chicken with olive oil, salt and pepper. Wrap in foil and bake in the preheated oven 1 to 1 1/2 hours, until internal temperature has reached 160 degrees F (70 degrees C).

Remove chicken from heat. Cool, debone and chop.

In a large bowl, mix chicken, mayonnaise and dill. Gently fold in grapes, mandarin oranges and sunflower seeds. Spread the mixture on miniature croissants. Cover and chill in the refrigerator until serving.
